Bills

First Reading

Adoption (Amendment) Bill 2003 Supplementary Appropriation (2002-2003) Bill

The Bills were read the first time and ordered to be set down for Second Reading pursuant to Rule 53(3) of the Rules of Procedure.

Second Reading

Adoption (Amendment) Bill 2003

The Secretary for Health, Welfare and Food moved the Second Reading and addressed the Council.

Question on the Second Reading proposed. The President stated that in accordance with Rule 54(4) of the Rules of Procedure, the debate was adjourned and the Bill was referred to the House Committee.

Supplementary Appropriation (2002-2003) Bill

The Secretary for Financial Services and the Treasury moved the Second Reading and addressed the Council.

Question on the Second Reading proposed. The President stated that in accordance with Rule 54(4) of the Rules of Procedure, the debate was adjourned and the Bill was referred to the House Committee.

Stamp Duty (Amendment) Bill 2002

Resumption of Second Reading debate

The debate on the Second Reading which had been moved on 11 December 2002 resumed.

Hon SIN Chung-kai, Chairman of the Bills Committee on Stamp Duty (Amendment) Bill 2002, addressed the Council on the Report of the Bills Committee on the Bill.

One Member spoke on the Bill.

The Secretary for Financial Services and the Treasury replied.

Question on the Second Reading put and agreed to.

Bill read the second time and committed to a Committee of the whole Council.

Committee Stage

The Council went into Committee and considered the **Stamp Duty** (Amendment) Bill 2002.

Question that clauses 1 to 8, 10 to 21, 23 and 25 stand part of the Bill proposed, put and agreed to.

Question that clauses 9, 22 and 24 stand part of the Bill proposed.

The Secretary for Financial Services and the Treasury moved amendments to the aforesaid clauses and addressed the Committee.

Question on the amendments put and agreed to.

Question that clauses 9, 22 and 24, as amended, stand part of the Bill proposed, put and agreed to.

The Council then resumed.

Third Reading

The Secretary for Financial Services and the Treasury reported that

the Stamp Duty (Amendment) Bill 2002

had passed through the Committee with amendments. He moved that the Bill be read the third time and do pass.

Question on the Third Reading proposed, put and agreed to.

Bill read the third time and passed.

Motions

<u>Proposed resolution under the Fixed Penalty (Public Cleanliness Offences) Ordinance</u>

The Secretary for Health, Welfare and Food moved the following motion and addressed the Council:

Resolved -

- (a) that Schedule 1 to the Fixed Penalty (Public Cleanliness Offences) Ordinance be amended in items 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, 6, 7 and 8 by repealing "\$600" and substituting "\$1,500"; and
- (b) that this Resolution shall come into operation on 26 June 2003.

Question on the motion proposed.

10 Members spoke on the motion.

The Secretary for Health, Welfare and Food replied.

Question on the motion put.

Hon James TIEN claimed a division. The President then ordered the Council to divide under Rule 47(1) of the Rules of Procedure.

The President announced that 45 Members were present, 32 were in favour of the motion and 12 abstained. (Voting record in the Appendix.) Since the question was agreed by a majority of the Members present, she declared that the motion was carried.

<u>Proposed resolution under the Interpretation and General</u> <u>Clauses Ordinance</u>

The Secretary for Constitutional Affairs moved the following motion and addressed the Council:

Resolved that the District Councils (Subscribers and Election Deposit for Nomination)(Amendment) Regulation 2003, published in the Gazette as Legal Notice No. 120 of 2003 and laid on the table of the Legislative Council on 21 May 2003, be amended in section 3, by repealing paragraphs (c), (d), (e) and (f) and substituting -

"(c) by adding -

"(3A) A person whose signature as a subscriber to a nomination paper is in surplus having regard to the required number of subscribers for the purposes of subsection (1) shall be regarded as not having subscribed the nomination paper.".".

Question on the motion proposed, put and agreed to.

<u>Proposed resolution under the Interpretation and General Clauses Ordinance</u>

The Secretary for Constitutional Affairs moved the following motion and addressed the Council:

Resolved that the Legislative Council (Subscribers and Election Deposit for Nomination)(Amendment) Regulation 2003, published in the Gazette as Legal Notice No. 119 of 2003 and laid on the table of the Legislative Council on 21 May 2003, be amended in section 3 -

- (a) by repealing paragraphs (a)(iii) and (b)(iii);
- (b) by repealing paragraphs (c) and (d) and substituting -
 - "(c) by adding -

"(2C) A person whose signature as a subscriber to a nomination paper is in surplus having regard to the required number of subscribers for the purposes of subsection (1)(a) or (2)(a)(ii), as the case may be, shall be regarded as not having subscribed the nomination paper."."

Question on the motion proposed, put and agreed to.

<u>Proposed resolution under the Interpretation and General</u> Clauses Ordinance

Hon IP Kwok-him moved the following motion and addressed the Council:

Resolved that in relation to the Electoral Affairs Commission (Electoral Procedure) (District Councils) (Amendment) Regulation 2003, published in the Gazette as Legal Notice No. 125 of 2003 and laid on the table of the Legislative Council on 21 May 2003, the period for amending subsidiary legislation referred to in section 34(2) of the Interpretation and General Clauses Ordinance (Cap. 1) be extended under section 34(4) of that Ordinance to the meeting of 9 July 2003.

Question on the motion proposed, put and agreed to.

<u>Proposed resolution under the Interpretation and General Clauses Ordinance</u>

Hon IP Kwok-him moved the following motion and addressed the Council:

Resolved that in relation to the -

- (a) Registration of Persons (Application for New Identity Cards) Order, published in the Gazette as Legal Notice No. 126 of 2003; and
- (b) Registration of Persons (Application for New Identity Cards) (Repeal) Order 2003, published in the Gazette as Legal Notice No. 127 of 2003,

and laid on the table of the Legislative Council on 21 May 2003, the period for amending subsidiary legislation referred to in section 34(2) of the Interpretation and General Clauses Ordinance (Cap. 1) be extended under section 34(4) of that Ordinance to the meeting of 9 July 2003.

Question on the motion proposed, put and agreed to.

Thanks for the Central Government's support

Hon NG Leung-sing moved the following motion and addressed the Council:

That this Council thanks the Central People's Government for its support to the Hong Kong Special Administrative Region in the battle against Severe Acute Respiratory Syndrome. While Hon NG Leung-sing was addressing the Council, the President left the chair at 6:30 pm temporarily and the President's Deputy, Hon Mrs Selina CHOW, took the chair.

Question on Hon NG Leung-sing's motion proposed.

The President's Deputy stated that Dr Hon LAW Chi-kwong would move an amendment to the motion. In accordance with the Rules of Procedure, the motion and the amendment would be debated together in a joint debate.

Dr Hon LAW Chi-kwong moved the following amendment to Hon NG Leung-sing's motion and addressed the Council:

To add "; at the same time, this Council urges the Hong Kong Government and appeals to the people of Hong Kong to provide supplies and medical support to the various provinces and cities in the Mainland, and make concerted efforts to prevent the epidemic and minimize the losses caused to the Mainland by Severe Acute Respiratory Syndrome" after "in the battle against Severe Acute Respiratory Syndrome".

Question on Dr Hon LAW Chi-kwong's amendment to Hon NG Leungsing's motion proposed.

12 Members and Hon TAM Yiu-chung spoke on the motion and the amendment.

At 7:40 pm, while Hon TAM Yiu-chung was speaking, the President resumed the chair.

One more Member spoke on the motion and the amendment.

Hon NG Leung-sing spoke on the amendment.

The Secretary for Health, Welfare and Food spoke on the motion and the amendment.

Question on Dr Hon LAW Chi-kwong's amendment to Hon NG Leungsing's motion put and agreed to.

Hon NG Leung-sing replied.

Question on Hon NG Leung-sing's motion as amended by Dr Hon LAW Chi-kwong put and agreed to.

Revitalizing tourism and encouraging spending

Hon Howard YOUNG moved the following motion and addressed the Council:

That this Council urges the Government to step up co-operation with various trades and industries to encourage spending through actively supporting community activities such as "We Love Hong Kong" that aim at reviving the economy, and to make its efforts in launching various types of promotional and publicity activities to attract more tourists to Hong Kong, so as to help revive the tourism industry.

Question on Hon Howard YOUNG's motion proposed.

The President stated that Dr Hon LAW Chi-kwong would move an amendment to the motion and that Hon Mrs Selina CHOW would also move an amendment to Dr Hon LAW Chi-kwong's amendment. In accordance with the Rules of Procedure, the motion, the amendment, and the amendment to the amendment would be debated together in a joint debate.

Dr Hon LAW Chi-kwong moved the following amendment to Hon Howard YOUNG's motion and addressed the Council:

To add "; and with increasing passenger flow, the Government should strengthen its quarantine measures at immigration control points on passengers from infected areas to prevent the spread of diseases" after "so as to help revive the tourism industry".

Question on Dr Hon LAW Chi-kwong's amendment to Hon Howard YOUNG's motion proposed.

Hon Mrs Selina CHOW moved the following amendment to Dr Hon LAW Chi-kwong's amendment and addressed the Council:

To add "at various immigration control points" after "and with increasing passenger flow"; to delete "at immigration control points" after "the Government should strengthen its quarantine measures"; and to add ", and at the same time deploy additional staff as appropriate to facilitate passenger movement, so as to maintain a smooth flow at the control points" after "passengers from infected areas to prevent the spread of diseases".

Question on Hon Mrs Selina CHOW's amendment to Dr Hon LAW Chikwong's amendment proposed.

Nine Members spoke on the motion and the amendments.

Hon Howard YOUNG spoke on the amendments.

The Secretary for Economic Development and Labour spoke on the motion and the amendments.

Question on Hon Mrs Selina CHOW's amendment to Dr Hon LAW Chi-kwong's amendment put and agreed to.

Question on Dr Hon LAW Chi-kwong's amendment, as amended by Hon Mrs Selina CHOW, to Hon Howard YOUNG's motion put and agreed to.

Hon Howard YOUNG replied.

Question on Hon Howard YOUNG's motion as amended by Dr Hon LAW Chi-kwong's amendment, which had been amended by Hon Mrs Selina CHOW, put and agreed to.
