#### Objectives

- build a competent IT workforce to ensure Hong Kong has the capability to compete in the global information economy
- provide adequate and quality IT manpower to meet market demand

#### Implementation progress of measures recommended by the IT Manpower Task Force



- expand post-secondary programme
  - 1,300 places in IT-related disciplines for F.5 and F.7 school leavers
- encourage world-renowned private IT training institutions to operate in Hong Kong
  - HKU SPACE and NIIT
- develop professional IT talents in the Cyberport
  - Cyberport Institute inaugurated in June 2002
  - 5 industrial founding partners: Cisco, HP, IBM, Microsoft & Oracle

# Implementation progress of measures recommended by the IT Manpower Task Force (Cont'd)



- accredit IT skills below degree level
  - VTC's IT Skills Assessment Centre
  - HKCS's International Computer Driving Licence
- encourage Hong Kong and Mainland talents overseas to work here
  - "Meet-the-students" sessions in overseas visits
  - Keep overseas Hong Kong student associations informed of latest ICT development in Hong Kong
- intensify exchange/internship programme with emphasis on IT
  - Pilot sponsorship scheme of summer IT exchange programme
  - Internship and Placement Service of the Cyberport Institute

### Implementation progress of measures recommended by the IT Manpower Task Force (Cont'd)



- provide professional IT training for secondary students in collaboration with the industry
  - "Train-the-trainer" programme
  - IT summer camps
  - Secondary Schools IT Training Scheme
- enhance IT content in university programmes
  - IT programmes for IT and non-IT university students
  - IT exit-tests
- promote and accept credit transfer/exemption in universities for IT-related disciplines
  - Higher education review: to introduce a credit unit accumulation and transfer system among UGC-funded institutions

# Implementation progress of measures recommended by the IT Manpower Task Force (Cont'd)



- IT corporate schools
  - Interest free loan for non-profit making education institutions to organise self-financing, full-time and accredited sub-degree IT programmes
  - Cyberport Institute
- admit Mainland IT professionals
  - 158 IT applications approved by December 2002
- streamline the admission regime for overseas IT professionals
  - 99% of the applications can be processed within two weeks

 Continue to implement measures recommended by the IT Manpower Task Force to ensure adequate provision of quality IT manpower in Hong Kong
