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## Q14 Precautionary measures adopted for visitors at TMH at Various Stages of the SARS Outbreak.

#### From 15 March 2003

Surgical masks provided to visitors of cohort cases.

- Gowns provided to visitors of cohort cases for close contact of patients.

#### 2. From 17 March 2003

- Visitors for cohort cases were restricted.
- All visitors requested to put on surgical mask on visiting.

#### 3. From 21 March 2003

Notices were posted up advising visitors to avoid staying in wards for too long.

#### 4. From 24 March 2003

Visitors control implemented in all designated wards. Visitors restricted and were
advised to put on barrier apparels and avoid close contact with the patient or touching
objects in the patient's near vicinity. They were advised to wash their hands when
leaving the ward.

#### 5. From 26 March 2003

- Visitors to SARS areas not allowed.

#### 6. From 9pm on 3 April 2003 after "No-Visiting Policy" was Implemented

- Visitors were not allowed to visit in-patient in all acute wards in TMH until further notice. For visitors insisted to visit the patient, advice and exceptional approval had to be sought from ward and Patient Relation Manager.
- For visits with exceptional approval:
  - Visitors were also requested to register with the security guard at the ward entrance.
  - Visitors of arranged visits were required to carry out strict infection control measures and would be provided with PPE when entering the ward.
  - The visit was limited to a maximum of 15 minutes.
  - Visitors were required to provide personal information, such as name, address, contact phone number, and name of and relationship with the patient whom the visitor requested to visit, to ward staff to facilitate tracing of contacts of infected personnel by the Department of Health.
- Notices were posted up to inform public on:
  - The "No-visiting Policy", except under very exceptional circumstances.

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- The need to carry out stringent infection control measures for all arranged visits.
- Security Guards were deployed outside the ward entrance on a 24-hour basis to prevent unauthorized access to wards and to minimize possible cross infection.
