## HA Review Panel on SARS Outbreak

This is in response to your letter of 24<sup>th</sup> June 2003 addressed to Dr. E.K. Yeoh, Secretary for Health, Welfare & Food.

The Hospital Authority (HA) was set up in 1990 as a statutory body under the HA Ordinance to manage and control public hospitals for the provision of hospital services. The functions of HA are set out in Section 4 of the HA Ordinance. These include, among others, managing and controlling public hospitals; managing and developing public hospitals system with a view to achieving efficient use of resources to provide hospital services of the highest standard within the resources possible obtainable. improving the efficiency of hospital services by developing management appropriate structures, systems

performance measures, and ensuring accountability to the public for the management and control of the public hospitals system, etc; and applying its resources towards the performance of its functions in the Ordinance, in particular the promotion, development and maintenance of hospital services.

Government, in this context the Health, Welfare and Food Bureau (HWFB), is responsible for the overall policy on the provisions of public hospital services and the setting of health policies in the total context of the political, economic and social environment. We entrust HA with the responsibility to oversee the operation and management of public hospitals, manage its own resources and deliver public hospital services to the community. While HA has autonomy in the management and control of public hospitals, it is accountable to the Government for the effective and efficient delivery of public hospital services.

In addition, the HA Ordinance also provides that the Chief Executive (of the HKSAR) may, if he considers the public interest so requires, give directions in writing of a general or specific character to HA in relation to the performance of its functions or the exercise of its powers and HA shall comply with those directions.

The role of the HWFB in relation to HA in handling the SARS crisis can be viewed in the above light. We are happy to discuss further on relevant matters of interest to the Review Panel.
