Priority of the Provision of Leisure and Cultural Services Facilities

Purpose

This paper reports on the priority for the provision of new leisure and cultural services facilities in Hong Kong.

Background

2. In April 2003, we reported to the Panel the latest position on the provision of new leisure and cultural services facilities. Members noted that we had obtained provision in the financial year of 2003/04 to implement 26 projects subject to funding approval of the Public Works Subcommittee (PWSC) and the Finance Committee (FC) and that two other projects would be implemented under the Private Sector Finance approach, where developers will be invited to develop and operate the facilities.

Provision of New Leisure and Cultural Services facilities

3. Apart from the 26 projects as referred to in paragraph 2 above, we have obtained provision in the financial year of 2004/05 to implement two more projects, subject to funding approval of the PWSC and the FC. In selecting

these projects, we have critically reviewed the priority, delivery mode and implementation schedule of the active projects in hand, and having regard to the shortfall of leisure and cultural services facilities in the new towns, distribution of facilities throughout the territory, facilities which are in heavy demand, and LCSD's financial capability to operate the facilities in the long term.

- 4. A list showing the latest position of these 28 priority projects is at **Annex**.
- 5. These 28 priority projects would entail total capital funding of around \$2,660M and annual recurrent cost of about \$55M which will be fully reflected by 2008/09. The current position of the 28 priority projects is summed up as follows -
 - (a) 14 projects upgraded to Category A since September 2002;
 - (b) 2 projects to be implemented as minor works items; and
 - (c) 12 projects awaiting upgrading to Category A.
- 6. Nine of these projects will be implemented through the Design-Build approach, as indicated at *Annex*, where private developers would be funded by the Government for designing and building the projects.

Private Sector Finance (PSF) Projects

The Pilot Projects

- 7. In July 2003, we informed Members vide LC Paper No. CB(2)2821/02-03(01) of the main features of the PSF approach and the progress we had made at that time i.e. we had identified the following two pilot PSF projects and formed a Task Force to take them forward:
 - (a) a leisure and cultural centre in Kwun Tong; and
 - (b) an ice sports center, a tenpin bowling center and a town park in Tseung Kwan O.
- 8. Under the pilot scheme, private sector developers would be invited to undertake the development and subsequent operation, management and maintenance of leisure and cultural facilities stipulated by the Government on a self-financing basis for a fixed period of time. In return, the developers would be allowed to develop at the sites other facilities which are permissible under the relevant zoning in order to make the projects commercially viable subject to the approval of the Town Planning Board as appropriate. In addition, the developer would be required to propose a pricing mechanism which would facilitate the use of the leisure and cultural facilities by members of the public at an affordable level, and which would encourage the use of these facilities by organizations which play a key role in the promotion of sports development, elite sports as well as arts and cultural programmes. The pricing mechanism and booking policy for the use of these facilities would have to be approved by

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the Government.

- 9. We invited developers to submit Expression of Interest (EoI) on the two pilot PSF projects mentioned in paragraph 7(a) and (b) above on 11 July 2003 in order to get the views of the market on the approach. A total of 10 submissions were received by the closing date of 15 August 2003. The majority of the submissions indicated interest in the projects though a number of them expressed concern on the financial viability.
- 10. We have engaged consultants to analyse these EoIs and to develop the development briefs for these two projects on the basis of the private sector undertaking them on a self financing basis.
- 11. We consulted Sai Kung and Kwun Tong District Councils on the pilot PSF projects in February and March 2004 respectively. Both Councils expressed support to the projects. We will seek the Town Planning Board's support on the development plans of the two pilot PSF projects shortly.

Tai Po Cultural Complex – a new PSF project in the pipeline

12. The proposal of developing a cultural complex in Tai Po through the PSF approach was raised at the Legislative Council case conference in May 2003. We subsequently decided to explore the adoption of the PSF approach and test the response of the market by the invitation of EoI. The Tai Po

District Council was informed in July 2003 and again consulted in March 2004 on the progress. The invitation for EoI is expected to be issued in the second quarter of 2004.

Other Major Facilities Under Planning

- 13. The Government also has plans to develop 40 hectares of land at the West Kowloon Reclamation into an integrated arts, cultural and entertainment district, the "West Kowloon Cultural District". An Invitation for Proposals to develop the whole area was launched in September 2003. The private sector was invited to submit proposals by 19 June 2004 on the provision and management of the arts and cultural facilities there.
- 14. A new heritage project is now under active planning after acquisition of Kom Tong Hall in early April 2004. It is anticipated that a submission will be made to PWSC/FC in late 2004/early 2005 to obtain the necessary capital funding for the renovation works to turn the building into a Dr Sun Yat-sen Museum.

The Way Forward

15. We will regularly review the priority, implementation schedule and the mode of delivery of leisure and cultural services projects having regard to the changing economic situations and LCSD's long term financial capability in commissioning new facilities. Depending on the response of the private sector on the pilot PSF projects, we would consider the possibility of inviting private

sector participation for some of the remaining projects suitable for this mode of delivery.
