Proposed timing for discussion

26 February 2018

1. Promoting the use of electric vehicles

The Administration will brief the Panel on the measures to promote the use of electric vehicles.

As suggested by members at the meeting on 12 October 2017, members would like to be briefed on policies and measures including the provision of battery charging facilities for electric vehicles and the Administration's plan to phase out conventional vehicles in the long run (also raised in Mr HUI Chi-fung's letter dated 12 October 2017 (LC Paper No. CB(1)86/17-18(01)). Mr Frankie YICK requested the Administration to consider measures for handling waste car batteries and waste tyres, and explore whether a recycling levy should be imposed for such disposal.

2. Upgrading of sewage pumping stations and sewerage along Ting Kok Road

The Administration will invite the Panel's views on the proposal to upgrade the sewerage item 4403DS – Upgrading of sewage pumping stations and sewerage along Ting Kok Road to Category A.

The Administration intends to submit the proposal to the Public Works Subcommittee and the Finance Committee in March and May 2018 respectively.

3. Enforcement against illegal land-filling and fly-tipping of construction waste

The Administration will update the Panel on the enforcement actions to combat illegal land-filling and fly-tipping of construction waste and the latest progress in the development of measures to facilitate enforcement.

4. Update on the progress of preparation for implementing Producer Responsibility Scheme on glass beverage containers

1st quarter of 2018

The Administration will brief the Panel on the legislative proposal in the first quarter of 2018.

5. Shek Wu Hui Effluent Polishing Plant

23 April 2018

The Administration will invite the Panel's views on the proposal to upgrade part of sewerage item 4388DS – Shek Wu Hui Effluent Polishing Plant – Main Works Stage 1 to Category A.

6. Rehabilitation of underground sewers and upgrading of Central & East Kowloon sewerage

23 April 2018

The Administration will invite the Panel's views on the proposal to upgrade the following sewerage items to Category A –

- (a) part of 4414DS Rehabilitation of underground sewers Stage 1; and
- (b) 4344DS Upgrading of Central & East Kowloon sewerage Phase 3

7. Implementation details of the Feed-in Tariff and Renewable Energy Certificates Schemes as well as new energy saving-related initiatives under the post-2018 Scheme of Control Agreements

1st or 2nd quarter of 2018

As suggested by members at the meeting on 12 October 2017, members would like to be briefed on: (a) details of the implementation of the Feed-in Tariff ("FiT") scheme to be introduced in the regulatory period of the Scheme of Control Agreements effective from 2018-2019 (including the setting of FiT rate(s)); (b) measures to encourage the private sector and the community to consider investing in distributed renewable energy; and (c) way forward of implementing floating photovoltaic systems on a larger scale at impounding reservoirs.

Members of the Panel on Economic Development to be invited to join the discussion on this item.

8. Implementation of Organic Resources Recovery Centre Phase 2

1st or 2nd quarter of 2018

The Administration will invite the Panel's views on the funding application for submission to the Public Works Subcommittee/Finance Committee for the implementation of Organic Resources Recovery Centre Phase 2. The Administration will also brief the Panel on the progress of its overall food waste management plan.

As suggested by Mr CHAN Hak-kan at the meeting on 12 October 2017, the Administration was requested to explore other feasible measures to reduce food waste in order to alleviate the pressure on landfills.

9. Tightening the emission standards of non-road vehicles under the Air Pollution Control (Non-road Mobile Machinery) (Emission) Regulation

1st or 2nd quarter of 2018 (tentative)

The Administration will brief the Panel on the proposed implementation timetable of the Euro VI emission standards for non-road vehicles (except light bus) newly supplied to Hong Kong.

10. Management of indoor air quality

1st or 2nd quarter of 2018

The item was proposed by Dr Helena WONG at the meeting of 18 October 2016. Members would like to discuss issues relating to the management of indoor air quality, including setting indoor air quality objectives, and establishing standards for hazardous emissions from household furniture.

11. Protection of endangered species of animals and plants and the review of relevant provisions under Cap. 586

2nd quarter of 2018

Raised by Mr HUI Chi-fung, Dr Elizabeth QUAT and Mr CHAN Hak-kan at the meeting on 12 October 2017. Members would like to discuss the review of relevant provisions under Cap. 586. Members also agreed to discuss issues relating to conservation of green turtle and possible expansion of Sham Wan Restricted Area (raised by Mr HUI in his letter dated 12 October 2017 (LC Paper No.

CB(1)86/17-18(01)), conservation of endangered shark species and control of shark fins trading, and conservation of incense tree through legislative control.

12. Management of marine fill and marine disposal of dredged/excavated sediment

2nd quarter of 2018 (tentative)

The Administration will brief the Panel on the management of marine fill and disposal of dredged/excavated sediments by the project owners.

The subject was raised by Mr Steven HO at the meeting on 15 December 2014.

At the meeting on 28 November 2016, Mr LEUNG Yiu-chung suggested the Panel to discuss the environmental issues relating to illegal disposal of construction and demolition materials into the sea/river. The Administration advised that these issues could be discussed under this item.

13. Review of Air Quality Objectives ("AQOs")

2nd or 3rd quarter of 2018 (tentative)

The Administration will brief the Panel on the findings of the AQOs review.

14. Combating Climate Change

4th quarter of 2018

The Administration will report the progress of its work on combating climate change.

As suggested by Mr CHU Hoi-dick at the meeting on 12 October 2017, members agreed that the item should be brought up for discussion by the Panel every year.

15. Review of the Environmental Impact Assessment Ordinance (Cap. 499)

To be confirmed

Mr Kenneth LEUNG wrote to the Panel Chairman on 24 November 2015 (LC Paper No. CB(1)202/15-16(01) issued on 26 November 2015) proposing discussion on the captioned subject. The Administration's response was circulated vide LC Paper No. CB(1)537/15-16(01) issued on 3 February 2016.

16. Implementation of the Integrated Waste Management Facilities ("IWMF")

The Administration obtained funding approval for IWMF (waste-to-energy facilities) from the Finance Committee in January 2015 and completed the prequalification exercise in tender invitation the same vear. The for Design-Build-Operate contract from the pre-qualified tenderers was issued in November 2016. The Public Accounts Committee ("PAC") has considered Report No. 65 of the Director of Audit, a chapter of which is on the Government's efforts in managing municipal solid waste.

PAC issued a referral memorandum dated 16 February 2017 (LC Paper No. CB(1)586/16-17(01)) recommending the Panel to follow up on issues relating to the captioned subject.

17. Existing policies on bicycles and promoting bicycles as a mode of transport as an initiative to improve roadside air quality

Mr HUI Chi-fung wrote to the Panel Chairman on 23 May 2017 (LC Paper No. CB(1)1009/16-17 issued on 24 May 2017) proposing to hold a joint meeting with the Panel on Transport to discuss issues relating to the existing policies on bicycles and promoting bicycles as a mode of transport. Mr HUI further wrote to the Panel Chairman on 12 October 2017 proposing to discuss bicycle-friendly policies (LC Paper No. CB(1)86/17-18(01)).

Separately, an item on "Cycling safety and consultancy study on cycling networks and parking facilities in existing new towns" is currently on the list of outstanding items for discussion of the Panel on Transport.

18. Development of an artificial bathing beach at Lung Mei in Tai Po

20. Excessive external lighting and noise pollution

As suggested by Dr Elizabeth QUAT and Mr SHIU Ka-fai at the meeting on 30 October 2017, members agreed to discuss the Administration's initiatives to regulate excessive external lighting and noise pollution at a future meeting. The Administration was urged to address the issue given its potential effect on public health.

21. Regulating the manufacturing and sale of products containing microplastics in Hong Kong

Hon KWOK Wai-keung wrote to the Chairman on 24 November 2017 (LC Paper No. CB(1)281/17-18(01)) proposing discussion on the captioned subject. The Administration's response was circulated to members on 15 December 2017 vide LC Paper No. CB(1)360/17-18(01). At the meeting on 19 December 2017, members agreed to include the item on this list.

22. Environmental pollution caused by "garages in urban areas"

To be confirmed

On 19 December 2017, the Panel received a referral (LC Paper No. CB(1)382/17-18(01)) arising from the meeting between Legislative Council Members and Eastern District Council members on 14 July 2017 concerning the safety issues of "garages in urban areas". The problem of garages/vehicle repair workshops which pollute the environment being located in residential areas had been referred to the Panel for follow-up.
